Anomalous origin of the left coronary from the pulmonary artery (ALCAPA) is a rare congenital malformation, which may result in myocardial infarction, congestive heart failure, and sudden death if left untreated. Despite frequently advanced pathologic changes, there seems to be significant potential for the recovery of myocardial function in individuals with left ventricular dysfunction after the establishment of physiologic coronary circulation, particularly in the pediatric population.
